Title and practice/project short description (max 1000 characters)	Live Museum, Live Change. ECCOM designs and implements pioneering experiences to promote cultural inclusion and participation in a perspective of cultural democracy. This project realized at the Rome Museum and "Mercati di Traiano", constitutes a model of valorization and community engagement, namely young people, in knowledge and management – economic too – of this unique heritage (https://www.eccom.it/project/live-museum-live-change/). The objectives encompassed education-training of School and University students, increasing of the audience and partnerships, experimentation of Art and Science practices and pathways, trigger of entrepreneurship and innovation, individual and group empowerment, creation of new dialogic and narrative forms. This project witness the value and inclusive power of intercultural and Art-Science experiences in the educational processes, socially oriented involving values, participation, responsibility, citizenship and the community future in a "real" socio-environmental context.
Notes on didactical /methodological innovation introduced (max 1000 characters)	A creative "inter-crossing" program between Art and Science and trans disciplinary approaches has been experimented, with focus on the cultural heritage, by a real citizen participation in a territorial vision entailing responsibility and commitments. Pedagogists acknowledge that artistic practices improve a creative culture, empower the student imagination, enhance motivation, self-esteem, autonomy and awareness of their own talents: all conditions that influence positively also the democratic participation of not expert or demotivated/excluded/marginalized citizen. ECCOM engaged students, artists, other social actors and common citizen to foster

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	different visions of the Site and valorize many approaches and interpretation for its knowledge <u>https://traianolivemuseum.com/</u>). Many Artists answered the call and worked with the other participants, the expert and common citizen. Among the many activities, some classes of two Rome High School (Mamiani e Dante) were employed in the creation of new experimental narrations of this heritage, inspired by the collaboration with the Artists. Another relevant experience with students has been implemented by the musician and composer Stefano Cataldi. The Artist and the students converted in music the main themes, the sounds and the architectural forms of the Site, creating a very challenging image of the Mercati di Traiano.
